


In today's modern society security awareness is essential. It is an effective deterrent which prevents individuals and businesses from becoming victims of crime.

How to secure your commercial property

- Ensure that your main access points are fit and secure for security, check that
 your door, roller shutter doors or other access points have locks that meet
 British Standards for Security (BS3621 for mortice locks and TS007 3 star for
 Euro Profile).
- If the door is to be replaced, fit doors that meets Loss Prevention Standards (LPS 1175 Security Ratings 2-6) appropriate for your business.
- Roller shutters or protection for ground floor or easily accessible windows should be considered. These should be from the LPS 1175 SR -2-6 standards commensurate with your business.
- A clean and tidy site gives a professional image which is often interpreted as secure and organised.
- Consider installing a monitored intruder alarm which can be supplemented with CCTV and Perimeter intrusion detection systems.
- Check your perimeter security regularly where appropriate, and ensure it is maintained to the security standard required. Link to a perimeter intrusion detection system.

Neighbourhood Watch Scotland

Watch schemes work well as a crime prevention and detection tool but are also extremely valuable in terms of enabling local communities to share information, allow agencies to send out relevant crime alerts, and empower local communities to be more resilient.
