East Berwickshire Community Councils Multi Member Ward Report for August 2025

Due to delayed reporting or recording of crimes, incidents or road accidents and the management of crime enquiries, there is likely to be differences between the information in this report and the final Police Scotland statistics. Community Update – East Berwickshire

PC Cameron and communtiy colleagues have been assisting with an issue in the ward area, alongside other services. Due to the sesitive nature of the issue, limited imformation can be given, however there were a number of reports of concern from members of the public including assault and shoplifting regarding an individual. Officers worked alongside the NHS, ensuring the individual involved received the care and support required. These processes take time and can often cause frustration for some members of the public, however, we will always seek to obtain the best outcomes for all involved, and especially for those people in crisis.

Additionally, Eyemouth community officers were involved in a number of high-profile incidents across their ward area. This included assisting the pro-active crime team in enforcing drugs warrants, community officers offered support in the execution of the warrants but also assisted with the aftercare for the families and children involved.

SLO PC Cameron and CBO PC Jacobs had the pleasure of assisting Eyemouth High School with a road test of their Greenpower Racing Car. EHS' Greenpower Racing Car program gives the children a fantastic opportunity to Build, maintain and race their vehicles, all in a sustainable, safe and eco-friendly way.

PS Granger and PC Jacobs met with representatives of Coldingham Community Council after concerns were raised about the diversion through their village when works are carried out on the A1, as well as spontaneous closures. Following a site visit, PS Granger has met with both SBC and BEAR Scotland. This work is ongoing and PC Jacobs will be at the next Coldingham CC meeting to discuss this issue with residents.

Protecting Vulnerable People in a Physical & Digital World

In August 2025 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around 202 mental health related calls, around 31 missing person enquiries and approximately 91 domestic related incidents.

East Berwickshire had 14 mental health related calls and 0 missing person enquires. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to this type of call within this report.

Police Scotland work in collaboration with key partners to assist the most vulnerable within the communities and to provide support.



Reducing Violence and Anti-Social Behaviour

Assaults

- On 02/08/25 an anonymous report received of a male having been assaulted at Eyemouth harbour. Ethical crime report submitted.
- On 09/08/2025 report of a threatening male at The Square, Abbey St. Bathans. One male arrested and charged with assault, possession of an offensive weapon, threatening and abusive behaviour and drugs offences. Relevant reports submitted

 glass panel of the front door. Officers attended. One male arrested and conveyed to Hawick
 Police Station where he was charged with vandalism and threatening and abusive behaviour.

- On 24/08/2025 report of a rear windscreen smashed on Hinkar Way, Eyemouth. Youth traced and reported.

Reducing Acquisitive Crime

Theft by Housebreaking

- On 02/08/2025 report of a beach hut at Coldingham Sands having been broken into and property having been taken. Crime Report submitted. Enquiries complete.
- On 05/08/2025 report of a locked workshop at Winfield Farm, Whitsome having been broken into and a quad bike having been taken from within. Crime Report submitted. Enquiries ongoing.

Theft

Improving Road Safety

Tackling Serious and Organised Crime

The Scottish Borders CID Proactive Unit executed 3 Drug & General Evidence Warrants during the month of August which resulted in significant quantities of class B drugs weapons and stolen property being recovered.

A cannabis cultivation with value of £770,000 was found near Peebles.

Drugs with a value of £1000 plus cash and weapons were recovered in Jedburgh during a search.

A male was stopped and searched in the Galashiels area during a vehicle stop resulting in personal amounts of cannabis being recovered and the male failing a roadside drug swipe and reported for RTA offences.

General Evidence Warrants were executed in Edinburgh following the theft of high value bikes at Glentress resulting in a male suspect being reported for theft.

Four people were arrested, and eight people were reported for drug related offences during the month. These incidents were within Peebles, Galashiels and Jedburgh areas.

OFFICIAL

Proactive CID would like to re-enforce the message to all wards that any drug related crime or organised criminality in the Scottish Borders can be anonymously reported via CrimeStoppers, who are an independent charity not connected to the Police. The public can of course still use 101 for this purpose too.

Overdose Awareness Day - Sunday, 31 August, 2025

Police Scotland is recognising International Overdose Awareness Day on Sunday, 31 August, 2025.

International Overdose Awareness Day is the world's largest annual campaign to raise awareness of overdose. It is a time to remember those lost to an overdose, acknowledge the grief of the family and friends left behind.

Following a successful pilot, Police Scotland commenced a national roll out of Naloxone to all frontline officers and since then there have been 791 successful administrations, potentially saving many lives.
